PM 214 -Christian Worship Thursday 6 p.m. - 8:50 p.m. Rev. Otis L. Davis, M.Div.

The purpose of this course is to give the student an overview of Christian worship. It is the goal of this class also to give them an understanding, preparing for and practicing Christian Worship; explore the foundations of Christian Worship and addresses both age-old traditional questions and takes up the latest in contemporary controversies.

NT 311-Paul's Prison Epistles Tuesday 6 p.m. - 8:50 p.m. (Priestley Chapel)
Rev. Robert E. McCallum, M.Div

The purpose of this course is to give the student an overview of Ephesians, Philippians, Colossians and Philemon. Special attention will be given to the argument, theology, and problem passages of each epistle. The student's Christian service will be enhanced by a better understanding of God's plan for the individual's role in the Church, and the example of Christ's humble servanthood. Practical insights for developing a philosophy of Christian living will be gained.

PM 221 –Homiletics I Monday 6 p.m. - 8:50 p.m. Rev. James E. Carson, M.Div.

This is a foundational course which considers the nature of preaching methods of sermon preparation, and delivery and problems of preaching. While students are exposed to a variety of approaches to sermon development, primary emphasis is given to expositional process which undergirds the preaching event. This course will also assist students in their interpretation skills of scripture and exegesis offers by the exegete: While equipping students to accurately delineate the gospel with passion and clarity to the laity in the context which they minister and serve abroad.
